

MEPOS - Vicon Allied Health Travelling Fellowship

Key Dates:

- Fellowship Application to open in August 2025
- Application Deadline 1st October 2025
- Winner to be Announced at the MEPOS Conference in Dubai, November 2025

MEPOS and Vicon are pleased to invite applications for a 10-day Fellowship in children's orthopedics in North America or Europe to support the professional development of the Allied Health practitioner. The aim of the Fellowship is to enhance their practice, establish and strengthen links and collaboration with North America and Europe.

The successful applicant can visit up to two departments as part of their travel. The Centers to be visited will be determined by their main clinical interest(s). Attendance of formal training courses or meetings at any Centre will not be funded.

Refundable airfares will be economy class and accommodation, food and transport within will be reimbursed at reasonable levels during the Fellowship.

Applicants must be a member of MEPOS in good standing and have a substantial children's practice. They must also be registered for the MEPOS Annual Conference in Dubai, November 2025.

Application will be made by e-mailing a covering letter, CV and two referees to the Allied Health Committee (AHC@mepos.me)

The winner must complete their Fellowship within a year of granting the scholarship.

Key Judging Criteria:

- *Need and Relevance:*

Judges assess the importance of the proposed travel and project to the applicant's professional development and the broader field of allied health.

- *Impact and Benefits:*

The judging panel will evaluate how the project will benefit patients, the organization, and the profession as a whole.

- *Project Achievability:*

The panel will assess whether the project is feasible and realistic within the given timeframe and resources.

- *Dissemination and Implementation:*

Judges will consider the applicant's ability to share their learnings and implement changes in clinical practice or research settings.

- *Applicant's Experience and Qualifications:*

The judging panel will evaluate the applicant's relevant skills, experience, and qualifications to ensure they are well-equipped to conduct the project.

- *Feasibility of Travel:*

The judging panel will also consider the necessity and practicality of the proposed travel, including the itinerary and locations selected.

- *Commitment to Making a Difference:*

The applicant's commitment to utilizing the fellowship experience to improve patient care and their profession is an important consideration.
